Homelessness study is focus for Lent



Pastor Laurie Feille invites us to reserve three Tuesday nights during this year's season of Lent to learn more about homelessness in Minnesota.

FCC will join with Gethsemane Episcopal, one of our partners in the Downtown Congregations to End Homelessness organization, in a special Lenten study on this critical issue.

The first two of these Tuesdays will be soup and supper evenings with a program. The last Tuesday will be an opportunity to share a meal with brothers and sisters who are homeless, and then visit Simpson Housing Services.

So mark your calendar for these dates:

<u>Tuesday, February 23</u>, 6 pm soup supper and program at Gethsemane Episcopal Church

Tuesday, March 1, 6 pm soup supper and program at SpringHouse Tuesday, March 8, 5:30 meal at Loaves and Fishes followed by a visit to Simpson Housing Services offices where a panel of Simpson Educators (people who are homeless) and Simpson staff will help us understand more about what is happening, what is needed and what we can do to make a difference about Homelessness.

Daytime Lenten Bible Study

Pastor Laurie will also lead a daytime Lenten Bible study on Thursday mornings at 10 am. This study will begin next week on Thursday, February 11 and continue every Thursday until Holy Week. Come for one session or for every session.

The people Jesus loved were shopping at the Star Market yesterday. An old lead-colored man standing next to me at the checkout breathed so heavily I had to step back a few steps.

Even after his bags were packed he still stood, breathing hard and hawking into his hand. The feeble, the lame, I could hardly look at them: shuffling through the aisles, they smelled of decay, as if the Star Market

had declared a day off for the able-bodied, and I had wandered in with the rest of them—sour milk, bad meat—looking for cereal and spring water.

Jesus must have been a saint, I said to myself, looking for my lost car in the parking lot later, stumbling among the people who would have been lowered into rooms by ropes, who would have crept

out of caves or crawled from the corners of public baths on their hands and knees begging for mercy.

If I touch only the hem of his garment, one woman thought, could I bear the look on his face when he wheels around?

FCC Board Notes

Eleven people attended the January 19, 2016, meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights include:

- Board Officers: A new chairperson for the board will be named soon. We have someone who is willing if there is support by way of a 3-person committee that would do some of the work i.e. SpringHouse board meetings, vice-chair, etc. The nominating committee has approached a few people about working on this committee. Martha Harris will continue as Recording Secretary and Pat Dunlop will continue as Treasurer. Karen Bowman will replace Barb Rusinak as Financial Secretary.
- Financials: As December ended, our 2015 income was \$330.51 more than our expenses. The board approved the proposed 2016 budget of \$354,462, which is \$1468 less than the 2015 budget. Skip Wolverton pointed out that we have a balanced budget because we take money out of the reserve fund.
- The board voted to have 7 instead of 8 **trustees** for the year 2016. Don Cain's spot will not be filled
- Mission and Outreach will streamline activities to avoid overlap. Instead of 4th Sunday loose offering the committee will promote special "gratitude offerings" in August and April that will go toward Dignity Center sandwiches and St. Stephen's meals. The focus in 2016 will be Homelessness issues.
