FCC Board Notes

Thirteen people attended the March 15 meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights of the meeting include the following:

- The board approved a motion to use memorial funds to **purchase a computer** for the Associate Pastor, who has been using his personal computer for church work.
- The board approved the formation of a "Building the Future Ministry Team." The group will focus on the future of the church including the financial needs for the future. Kirsten Cackoski will head up the group.
- Two representatives from FCC are needed for the SpringHouse safe church policy review. The group will meet from 2-4 times to review the 5-year old SH Safe Church Policy.
- Treasurer Pat Dunlop presented the Treasurer's Report. \$17,728 was received in pledge income for February, which is \$1686 more than the monthly expected income.
- The Finance Committee notified the board of a budgeting error recently discovered in the Worship budget.

Reflections on the Word

Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon vou; and vou will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."
