SpringHouse children participate in OWL program By Kathy Hayden



Our Whole Lives (OWL) is a sexual education program with resources written by professional sexuality educators. It has accurate, age-appropriate information to help individuals make informed and responsible decisions about their sexual health and behavior. OWL provides not only facts about anatomy and human development, but helps participants clarify their values and understand the spiritual, emotional, and social

aspects of sexuality.

During the fall of 2016, 4th and 5th graders from SpringHouse Ministry Center and First Congregational Church joined together for eight weeks of OWL lessons. We had a total of seven young people, including four boys from First Congregational and three girls from SpringHouse (one from each congregation). The facilitators were Ann Fate and Paul Snyder from First Congregation and Kathy Hayden from SpringHouse.

I talked to our girls about their experiences. Shannon shared, "It's hands on," "we dived right in," and "some of the lessons made me squeamish." Betty thought it was cool because she got to meet new kids and the lessons were fun. Elizabeth stated she "probably" learned something new. She read all of the book "It's Perfectly Normal" before the first class. About the book Elizabeth said, "The pictures didn't affect me too much." She "wasn't surprised and expected it in a book like that." Betty thought the book was "different" and "very descriptive." Shannon thought the book was "interesting" and "didn't love the pictures." In her thoughtful analysis the book was a distraction during the lessons. It did add a lot of giggles and boy- and girl-only huddle discussions.

Our girls are very insightful and mature. The one question at least one kid would put in the question box each week was "can we have a pizza party." As a facilitator it would be fun to have some follow up discussions with this group of amazing boys and girls.

FCC Board Notes

Below are highlights from the November and December FCC board meetings. Sixteen people attended the November meetings, and six people were present in December.

- This year's Nominating Committee is made up of Kirsten Cackoski, Karen Kandik and Becki Whitaker. They will have a roster of nominees for trustee, diaconate and elder positions ready for the January annual meeting.
- Worship services are now being broadcast through YouTube livestreaming. Eleven people watched the December 11 service when the icy roads kept many people at home. Discussion focused on seeking permission for children to be shown on the broadcast.
- As of December, a total of \$189,320 has been pledged for the 2017 budget. The October income was \$24,831, which included interest income and SH staff reimbursements.
- Skip Wolverton presented the 2017 proposed budget and the board voted to approve it. It will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting on January 22.
- Pastor Laurie and Pastor Rhonda will be interviewing to find one or perhaps two people to replace Serena Chial in Child Care.

Reflections on the Word

Luke 4: 16b-18a: He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me..."

Luke's story has Jesus launching his ministry in his hometown of Nazareth, where he reads the words of Isaiah and claims them for his own ministry. His listeners go from being impressed to being outraged as Jesus says that he has come for the outsiders, not the insiders sitting in front of him in the synagogue. Once again, the words of Jesus speak clearly us as well.
