In Minnesota, March means Minnesota FoodShare Month. The FoodShare March Campaign is the largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state, accomplished by participating groups and individuals engaged in the fight against hunger in support of 300 partner food shelves.

This year, First Christian is participating in this campaign by encouraging members to donate money to the **Groveland Food Shelf**, the food shelf we have supported for decades. (The donations are in lieu of a huge bank of Easter Lilies in the Sanctuary on Easter morning.) FCC members can make donations to



Groveland "in honor of" or "in memory of " someone special. On Easter morning, an insert in the bulletin will list of all those honored or remembered through a donation.

Forms for indicating the honorees as well as pre-labeled green donation envelopes are on the literature table in the sanctuary. If you write a check, make it payable to First Christian and put Groveland in the memo. You may also give to Groveland by using the Givelify App.

When I work too hard to come up with an idea – artistic or otherwise - I never get one. The more I think about it, the more elusive it becomes. I had been trying to think of an art theme to use for Lent /Advent 2018, but nothing was coming. When Pastor Laurie asked during a 2017 staff planning retreat what we should use as our art focus for 2018, I said, "I got nuthin"."

• Wendy Manual of the Sanctuary/Immigrant Welcoming Task Force thanked everyone for supporting the work of this group. The committee has published a list of three ways to support immigrant families (this list was published in the Courier on February 24).

• Details for the Family Dinner honoring Max and Mary Hurlocker on February 25 were reviewed.

 Belinda Flanagan expressed concerns about getting someone to make needed repairs on the new bells. She will research local people who can make these repairs.

• Pastor Laurie reported that 9 or 10 people have expressed interest in the summer Detroit Mission Trip. The church received a \$500 gift from the family of Lois McKinnen to be used for mission trips.

Trustee Skip Wolverton gave the Treasurer's report for Treasurer Pat Dunlop. January pledged income was \$16,048.
