Pastors Laurie and Dan serve church in new way

As we all know, Pastor Laurie Feille and Pastor Dan Adolphson wear many hats. In addition to all the preaching, pastoral and administrative work they do here at First Christian Church and in the Twin Cities, they both contribute to the life of the church at the regional and national level.

Recently, they had a unique opportunity to serve the denomination in a new way, as bus drivers for the meeting of the General Board of the Disciples of Christ at the Camp Conference Center in Newton Iowa.

Pastor Laurie explained how the General Board landed in Iowa: "Our Regional Minister, Rev. Bill Spangler-Dunning, suggested the Christian Conference Center as a model on cutting the costs associated with the General Board Meetings. The General Board meets once a year and the meetings happen in a hotel in Indianapolis which costs a lot. It was cheaper to fly everyone to Iowa and meet at the Conference Center than meeting in a hotel in Indianapolis."

The General Board is no small group: close to 100 people gathered for this board meeting in Newton over the weekend of April 14-17. Asked if they participated in the meetings, Laurie explained, "Dan and I are not on the General Board. General Board meetings operate with an Open Meeting Policy which means anyone can sit in and listen. Dan and I listened in on several of the meetings. Running the transportation was exhausting so we did not sit in on every meeting. Some mornings we had to start running between the hotels and the Conference Center by 6:30 a.m. Most nights we were not through until 9:30 p.m. We provided transportation Friday morning through noon on Tuesday.

General Board members serve four-year terms, and include laypeople and ministers representing many layers of the Disciple organization: the General Assembly, the various regions, the General Ministries (such as Disciples Home Mission, National Benevolent Association, etc), the governing bodies of the National Bi-Lingual Hispanic Fellowship, North American Pacific Asian Disciples, and the National Convocation, and numerous *ex officio* members, both voting and non-voting, such as present and former General Ministers, and ecumenical members from other North American Communions.

FCC Board Notes

Fourteen people attended the April 17 meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights of the meeting include the following:

• Belinda Flanagan reported that a company has been contracted to make repairs to the newlyacquired handbell set. The cost of the repairs will come from Memorial Funds.

• Four people attended worship on The Great Snow Sunday, including Adam Conrad who led the music, elder Wendy Manuel, deacon Anna Bliss, and a stopby visitor who happened to be a Baptist minister; he gave a short homily.

• Mission at our Doorstep will be July16-19. The Detroit Mission Trip leaves July 21 and returns July 29; currently 14 people are committed to the trip.

• The Joint Worship / End of Sunday School service will be Sunday, May 20, which is also Pentecost Sunday. The Sanctuary Move will be Monday, May 21.

• Treasurer Pat Dunlop reported that \$1357 was received for the Easter/March foodshelf drive, and was distributed to Groveland Foodshelf. She also reported that March actual income was \$15,935, and that currently income and expenses are in line with budget projections for the year.

Book Review

The SpringHouse library committee is seeking to add books to the SpringHouse library that help fulfill the missions of our churches. One of the newest books in the collection is *Strangers in Their Own Land* by Arlie Russell Hochschild.

Roger Livdahl of Salem wrote a review of this book. We don't have room for his whole review here, but here are some highlights:

"Hochschild, a sociologist from Berkeley, CA, decided that she wanted to get to know he people of the South, what they really believe, and perhaps, why they vote the way they do. She developed a respectful listening relationship with several individuals and families through Louisiana.

"Robert B. Reich, chancellor's professor of public policy, U of California, Berkeley says: 'With compassion and empathy, Hochschild discovers the narrative that gives meaning and expression to these peoples' lives and which explains their political convictions along with much else. Anyone who wants to understand modern America should read this captivating book'.

"The author completes her book with 27 reading group guide questions."
