# Mission to Detroit coming up in July

The SpringHouse annual mission trip will be to Detroit, MI this summer to again work with Rippling Hope. Participants will help Detroit residents with home improvement projects. There is work for novices and experts so no experience is necessary. The bus will leave Saturday, July 21, and return Sunday, July 28. A majority of the trip will be in Detroit, but participants will also spend a day in Michigan's Upper Peninsula and probably cross over into Canada.

# Materials for Hospice Kits needed for day campers



## On letting yourself be vulnerable

"Never let them see you sweat!" Some of us might be old enough to remember that deodorant commercial from the 1980s. If memory serves correctly, the gist of the ad was that one could be nervous about something or be in a vulnerable position, but no one nearby should know it. This product would prevent that from happening.

I don't know about you, but most of us do not enjoy vulnerability. We don't like to be perceived as weak, helpless, or needy. Sometimes we behave like toads that hide in the grass in the summertime —we puff ourselves up to look bigger than we feel! We would prefer that NO ONE see us sweat. It is not easy to be exposed. Or endangered. Or open. However, it is valuable to reflect on those places in our lives that need to be examined, broken open, brought to light. Even as a community of faith, it is important to examine those things that make us sweat, make us fearful, make us vulnerable. Vulnerability is not weakness. In our brokenness, we can discover innovation, creativity and change. Vulnerability can be the glue that holds us together in community.

An ordinary egg can be a metaphorical tool to help us discover truths about our own vulnerability. So what do eggs and vulnerability have in common? Being vulnerable has risks. Eggs can be smashed like Humpty Dumpty. Look at an egg—fragile shell, easily broken, easily beaten—but think of all the things we gain from broken eggs. How many ways can you cook an egg? How many recipes include eggs? Innovation, creativity and change flow from that broken egg. Eggs are "glue" to bind cooking ingredients together. They are emulsifiers that allow oil and water to be combined without separating. Some folks even put the eggshells in their coffee! However, an egg is not especially useful until its shell is cracked. Allowed to sit unbroken in the carton for too long, it will rot!

I need to be willing, we all need to be willing, to be opened up, explored and known—to ourselves, to each other, to God. Opening ourselves, we can say with the Psalmist, "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts. See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

### **Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance issues statement**

Pastor Dan Adolphson, currently moderator of the Disciples LGBTQ+ Alliance, released a statement on behalf of the Alliance about the recent Supreme Court decision regarding the Colorado bakery. The statement ends by saying, "We look forward to upcoming cases that will allow the Supreme Court . . . to more clearly spell out that "religious freedom" is absolutely NOT a valid legal reason for discrimination in society and commerce."

## Immigrant Welcoming Action

As a Sanctuary Supporting / Immigrant Welcoming congregation, we can take action to assist a local man who is under threat of deportation. Armando, A DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) was picked up in December, 2017, by ICE. His case was highlighted at the May 22 Immigrant Justice action of the Poor People's Campaign. After paying a \$6000 bond, he was released and his case is now moving through the courts.

His family debts now include bond repayment and legal fees, and a GoFundMe site has been set up to help the family: <u>http://www.gofundme.com/Hel</u> <u>pArmandoOUT980</u>

His sister Samantha says, "We are a real family dealing with real trauma from this horrible situation. My mom and I both work two jobs to be able to deal with this financial situation. I'm heading off to college as a freshman this fall and your support would relieve a lot of financial burden for my mother and me."
