## Detroit 2018 servant workers use their gifts

Jon Krengel had seen pictures of Detroit from past mission trips, but he didn't realize the extent of the neighborhood needs. Laurie Feille felt her heart sink a little when she saw the same boarded-up houses she had taken photos of two years ago. But they, along with 13 other SpringHouse workers, rolled up their sleeves and got to work.

"I felt like part of a support team, there to shore people up," said Krengel.

The group split up into smaller teams, and were sent out each morning to do a job, and then often sent out somewhere else for another task in the afternoon. The teams built a chain link fence, painted doors, cleaned gutters and did dozens of other tasks to help people in Detroit improve their homes and their neighborhood.s

Steve Rusinak noted that the SpringHouse team stayed in the new Rippling Hope Mission Center, housed in a former bank

building that became available when a major bank closed and gave its buildings in Detroit away.

All week long, the group
"used the gifts God has
given them, relying on
God for hope," as Pastor
Laurie said in her sermon
on David and Goliath.
These gifts, used together,

What a busy summer it has been – camps, servant trip, Mission at Our Doorstep, vacations, worship services (with smores! I can't begin to tell you how sorry I am to have missed that!), plus everything else from plain old life. Can you believe that there are only three weeks until Labor Day?

Within all this activity of ours this summer, where have you seen God's presence? Felt or experienced God's love at work? Have you able to spend some quality time with God?

Think about this for a bit. First of all, have you experienced for yourself quality time with God? I certainly hope so! Was this something that happened at worship either here at First Christian or another service you were able to attend this summer? Perhaps there was something specific, such as the music or the sermon, or a prayer that created that time with God for you.

Or maybe there was something outside the confines of the building that created that quality time with God for you. One of the Mission at Our Doorstep activities? A specific occurrence in Detroit or even just participating in the servant trip? A gathering of family members? Vacation or an adventure? Something you read or a story you were told?

I was lucky enough to have been invited to be on the teaching faculty at Holden Village for two weeks this summer. Holden is situated in the Cascade Mountains in Washington state in the Wenatchee National Forest. This is where I spent quality time with God – in nature, with a doe going past my bedroom window in the morning followed by her fawn; sitting on the front porch swing staring at the mountains; watching chipmunks scavenging for food; going at a slower pace, with absolutely no cell coverage and extremely spotty wifi.

Time spent like this helped me to reconnect – to my own roots, to myself, to others, and to God. My quality time at Holden has become a touchstone for me. I use those reflections and memories to step out of my own busy-ness and reach for that quality time: anytime, anywhere, for however long I need or want. I have found that this quality time rejuvenates me in order for me to continue working as God's hands and feet. Remember, you must put on your own oxygen mask first.

There are no limits on quality time with God except for those we impose on ourselves. We just need to open up and invite God in.

#### Reflections on the Word

1 Kings 19:4-8

Elijah struggles with many things, but nothing more than himself. We can all probably recognize how we can be our own worst enemy. 1 Kings 19 clearly demonstrates Elijah's demons bringing him to a standstill. Oftentimes, it is easy for us to see the source of other people's problems. We have seen many triumphs of Elijah before this event, and we know that there will be many triumphs to follow. With all of this in mind it can be hard to understand how things went so wrong so quickly for Elijah. Yet that is part of Elijah's story just like it can often be part of our story. We can often find ourselves most at risk, when we are feeling most invulnerable.
