Sanctuary Luncheon to feature true-life stories



Yolanda Salas Guzman will prepare a delicious Mexican meal for the SpringHouse Sanctuary and Immigrant Welcoming Fundraiser Lunch on Sunday December 2. The luncheon will be at noon, following worship services.

The fundraiser luncheon program will feature testimonies from asylum seekers and stories about the sacred work of sanctuary. A family from Honduras will

share their story of escape from terror in Honduras, their pathway through Central America and Mexico, their crossing of the US border, and their arrival in Minneapolis where they seek refuge. The mother's case for asylum is presently in the immigration courts.

Proceeds from the luncheon will benefit an asylum-seeking family and the South Minneapolis Sanctuary Coalition.

FCC Board Notes

Ten people attended the regular October meeting of the FCC General Board. Highlights of the meeting include the following:

- Kirsten Cackoski reviewed the work done by the Covenant Review Committee. Each SH governing board will vote on recommending the Covenant to their congregations for approval. The SH board will meet on Nov. 11 to review the revisions and make recommendations to the churches. FCC's board will work through the revisions at the November 27 meeting.
- The December meeting of the board will be to discuss the 2019 budget.
- The annual congregation meeting will be January 13, 2019, following worship. The SpringHouse annual meeting is January 27.
- Trustee Skip Wolverton reported on finances in Treasurer Pat Dunlop's stead. He stated that "things are in pretty good shape." The board approved the report.
- Pastor Dan Adolphson and Kirsten Cackoski are seeking volunteers to help with the November Q-Quest, which FCC has supported for many years. Pastor Laurie will attend the Church Extension Board meeting in Indianapolis.

Habakkuk 1:2 - Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save?
