# Lent: a good time for study and worship

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the forty days of Lent here at SpringHouse and around the world. Each year, FCC's worship staff

chooses an art focus – last year was poetry, and other years have featured fabric and visual art. The art focus at FCC this year will be drama. SpringHouse will continue its tradition of Lenten Holden Prayer services on Wednesdays at 6 pm.

The SH Adult Education focus for Lent will be **Social Justice through the Eyes of Prophets You May Not Know.** Each Sunday in March participants will learn about and discuss how some of the Biblical prophets underpin social justice. Adult Ed meets at 9:30 in the Gathering Space.

Looking ahead, here are the dates for the rest of the Lent/Easter season:

Palm Sunday, April 14 Maundy Thursday, April 18 Good Friday, April 19 Easter, April 21

In case you need a refresher, here is a brief definition of Lent: "Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. #### **Bostick Select Fund**



A new investment fund has been approved by the Christian Church Foundation: the Bostick Select Fund. Rev. Sarah Lue Bostick (1868-1948) was one of the first African American women ordained in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), serving for over 40 years. She was a devoted worker for the Christian Woman's Board of Missions and the National Christian Missionary Society. Her collection of missions literature was given to the Disciples of Christ Historical society, and opened an unparalleled window into women's and African American studies in the Stone-Campbell movement.

The Bostick Select Fund will be an active, faith-based investor, excluding investments in fossil fuels, weapons manufacturers, and companies targeted for divestment because of their involvement in perpetuating the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The Fund will actively invest in environmentally sustainable companies as well as those responding to an increasing global population. This fund, like Rev.
