## Mission team has outreach opportunities

FCC's Mission and Outreach team always has opportunities for FCC members to reach out to needs in the community. The team is looking for people to help out in several ways:

- Groveland Food Shelf donations. During this Lenten season, cash donations are encouraged, because more food can be made available that way instead of collecting actual food items as we have done in the past.
- April 13 meal at St. Stephens. Bonnie Ford is coordinating this project and is inviting people to help prepare and serve a meal on Saturday evening, April 13. She has a sign-up sheet in the sanctuary; also, you can call the church office to sign up
- Sheridan Story. On the second and fourth Friday of every month, FCC workers go to Whittier School to distribute five-pound food bags in children's lockers, so that the families can have sufficient food for the family over the weekend. It only takes about 45 minutes to deliver the food, and it's fun to see all the lively goings-on at this neighborhood school. A sign-up sheet for this is also in the sanctuary.

All of these opportunities are excellent ways to practice Lenten generosity!

### Prayer vigil and Friday communion during Lent

FCC's annual Prayer Vigil will begin on Thursday, April 18 at 8 pm (right after the Maundy Thursday service) It will continue until 3 pm on Friday, April 19. The Prayer Vigil is a long tradition at First Christian; you will be part of generations who have done this before you. This year you will again be able to sign up on line on the church's website; you will be notified when the sign up goes live. In the meantime, be thinking about what half hour time slot(s) you wish to use for your private praying. Time slots go quickly! More information to follow soon!

## FCC busy making plans for the year!

Summer is almost here! Yes, I know that it is still March. I know that we are in the middle of Lent and we haven't reached Easter yet. I know all of this but the planning, dreaming and visioning for the church continues year round. Easter is planned and Pentecost is pretty well planned too so we are now focused on summer and all that we have ahead.

Since I am leaving on sabbatical on August 1<sup>st</sup>, I have felt the pressure of getting everything planned for the fall before I go. That has caused me to be on top of planning for the summer. While that is a good thing it is also overwhelming when you sit down and realize everything that we do as church.

When Mission and Outreach met this past week, we thought that it would be a good idea for everyone to get the dates for Mission at Our Doorstep on your calendars. It is an important week in the life of our church and we need everyone who is able to participate. This year the dates are: June 24-27. We will have different outreach opportunities that include a cook out for the guests of St. Stephens Shelter and packing food at Feed My Starving Children.

We also have the opportunity to serve our neighbors long before summer arrives. During Lent we are collecting money for Groveland Food Shelf instead of spending money on lilies. We have the opportunity on several Fridays a month to pack food in children's backpacks at Whittier School. This allows the children to have food over the weekend. We will be serving a meal for the guests of St. Stephens Shelter on April 13 and will need volunteers to help. On Thursday, May 2, we are signed up to pack food at Feed My Starving Children from 6:00 p.m.-7:30 p.m. at the Coon Rapids location. Join in with the meal at St. Stephens and the Feed My Starving Children packing session to get ready for those activities during Mission At Our Doorstep!

As we look forward to the summer weather and all that the summer days bring our way I hope that you will put the dates for Mission At Our Doorstep on your calendar. We also have members who will be participating in the Servant Trip to South Dakota July 28-August 3. They will need our prayers and our financial support as they go to learn more about our neighbors.

Our church participates in some type of outreach every month. It is a part of who we are as a community of faith and it is who we are called to be as followers of Jesus Christ. ## Some parking notes for SpringHouse

Did you know...?

- The parking lot between SpringHouse and the Greenleaf apartment building is owned by Greenleaf.
- The only Greenleaf parking spaces that are always "ours" are the seven spaces marked with the small sign that says *SpringHouse*. This includes Sunday mornings. If any of the other spots besides the ones that are 24-hour reserved are open, we may use them, but they are not exclusively ours to use.
- If you don't already have one, parking stickers/hang tags are available from the Building Use Coordinator Deb Murphy. They aren't absolutely necessary, but it can be a good idea to have one.
- Since Intermedia Arts no longer exists, neither does our arrangement to use that parking lot on Sunday mornings. Michael Vanderford is pursuing this possibility with the new owners of that building.

As a reminder, we may use the Trustone lot on Sunday mornings. They just ask that we leave the spot closest to the door available for any customers who might stop to use the ATM just inside that door. We have been granted use of the space until 1 pm. After that, unless special arrangements have been made by Deb Murphy, your car may be towed.

#### **FCC Board Notes**

Twelve people attended the March 19 meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights of the meeting are as follows:

- The board voted to approve spending from Memorial Funds for two new office computers.
- A new SpringHouse Investment Committee has been created. Skip Wolverton volunteered to be FCC's representative to this group.
- The April board meeting was moved to April 23, so that it would not be during Holy Week.
- We will have two worship services on Easter, one at 8 am and the other at 10:30 am.
- Pastor Dan Adolphson testified at the State Capitol recently about a bill to outlaw Conversion therapy. Dan is working with Outfront Minnesota in efforts to pass this bill.
- Money from the Mavis Rusinak Fund can be used for General Assembly expenses. Anyone interested in this should contact Pastor Laurie.
- The Treasurer's report, given by Skip Wolverton, showed that at the end of February, the yearto-date actual income was \$22,076. The anticipated budget income was \$26,083.
