Weeks ago, Adam sent Brian the list of scriptures for Lent, and the lyricist created words to reflect significant language or ideas in each text. Adam then set these words to music for the choir.

The responses are brief, and according to Adam, it usually just takes one rehearsal for the choir to learn one.

Adam will also be providing original music during the Holy Week services.
