

Romans 5:1-11 Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. 
Morning help (9-12:30): We need help with welcoming kids, serving snacks, and adult presence.
