Editor's Note: This lovely poem seemed appropriate not just for Father's Day, but also for this column of spiritual reflections. I'll leave it to readers to work out theological implications of Hempel's tender evocation of a parent's love that carefully listens to and responds to the individual needs of beloved children.

His New Twin Daughters

Even now, after all these years, my father, 89, still uncertain when I call whose voice it is—Ann's or mine—

saying *Hi, Dad,* and from where, the next town or a different state, still pausing in that powdered air, this little silence as he waits

at the nursery door, discerning tone and pitch, listening hard to know which way to bend, which crib, the one against the wall or by the window,

still concentrating, trying to keep us separate, our needs, do what *she* would, letting my mother sleep, this moment's blank as he's about

to choose between us, make some shift in the soft-lit dark, decide whose cry it is tonight, which girl to lift, to whisper or hum, which lullaby.

Eleven people attended the May 21 meeting of FCC's general board. Highlights from the meeting include the following:

• Doug Mork, a staff member with Twin Cities Social Cohesion, spoke to the board about his work.

• Kirsten Cackoski presented a Wholeness Fund request from the South Minneapolis Day Camp for \$1500 for an artist-inresidence and for various supplies for the camp. Request was approved by the board.

• The Renewal Planning Team is planning many Congregational Renewal activities during Pastor Laurie's sabbatical. Details will be announced soon.

• The SpringHouse Ministry Center Board approved a payment for a recent street assessment.

• FCC will be able to send two official delegates to July's General Assembly. The board will vote in June on the two delegates.

• Skip Wolverton presented the Treasurer's Report, which showed that as of April, actual General Offerings were \$4,415 **ahead** of the projected budget.
