# FCC Board Notes

Ten people attended the June 18 meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights of the meeting include the following:

- Lu Griffin and Mike Hesano were nominated and agreed to serve as FCC's official delegates to General Assembly in July.
- Deb Murphy polled the board and learned that only a few people knew about or used the online calendar for FCC and SpringHouse. She is hoping more people can use it as a tool for planning ahead on scheduling while Laurie is on sabbatical.
- Sunday, July 28 will be a "send-off" for Pastor Laurie as she begins her three-month sabbatical. A full calendar of "renewal activities" for the congregation will be published soon.
- Pat Dunlop mentioned that FCC has dedicated funds to support women in ministry and learning activities and proposed that the funds could be used by women going to General Assembly. The board made and passed a motion to approve this use of the funds.
- Treasurer Pat Dunlop presented the Treasurer's report and noted that we are still ahead of where the budget projected us to be by the end of May.
