FCC Board Notes

Twenty-four people attended the March 21 meeting of FCC's General Board. Highlights of the meeting were as follows:

- The board voted unanimously to sign on as supporting General Assembly Resolution "Recognizing a truth and healing council to honor our covenantal relationship with indigenous peoples and to discern ways of reparations for a path to reconciliation.:
- Pastor Laurie Feille announced that her sabbatical will be August 2 – October 31, 2023. Board chair Kirsten Cackoski said we will again be doing congregational activities during the sabbatical.
- The board voted unanimously to designate the Trustees to oversee memorials as well as bequests going forward.
- Two important volunteer positions at FCC need to be filled: 1) a person to be trained in to help with FCC Treasurer responsibilities, and 2) a chairperson for the Worship committee.
- The Board was happy to acknowledge the return of deacons to help serve communion during worship.
- FCC Treasurer Pat Dunlop reported that pledged receipts for February came to \$12,535, which is close to the hoped-for amount budgeted. \$1,000 was donated to World Central Kitchen.
