FCC Membership survey coming soon

Since August, the church has been busy with fun and sociable sabbatical activities (pool parties, Como Park picnic, and much more). But at the same time, the church board has been engaged in some serious conversations about our church's future.

At the regular August 18 board meeting, an ad hoc committee was created to consider the challenges we face as our church moves forward into a changed world. This group met August 29 and brought reflections and ideas to a specially-called board meeting on September 5. One idea that emerged from this board meeting was to have small groups of all the members meet to talk about how First Christian can move into the future.

At the regular September 19 board meeting, a group of five people volunteered to start planning for these small group meetings. This group (Kirsten Cackoski, Jay Hillestad, Arlene Jorgenson Hillestad, Ron Keith, and Martha Harris) decided to first create a survey for every member of the church to consider what is important to them about First Christian Church. The results of the survey will be the basis of conversations in small groups. Both the survey and the discussions will be based on these questions:

What is it you most value about First Christian Church? What is it at First Christian that keeps you connected? What is First Christian good at that others might be attracted to?

The survey will be sent to each member of the church, either by an email link to the online survey or by U.S. mail. We are asking that the surveys be taken and returned by November 10. The next step will be to meet in small groups, either in person or on zoom, so we can reflect together on what we value about First Christian. More details and dates for these meetings will be coming soon, but right now, we are hoping to schedule them between November 13 and December 9.

As Interim Pastor Bob Brite used to say, "We make plans. God laughs." So, while we have dates in mind for the survey to be sent and returned and for small group meetings to be held, we will be flexible and make changes as needed.

Pastor Dan injured, has surgery in Iowa



Pastor Dan Adolphson fell from a ladder on Saturday, October 21, while at the All-Congregational Gathering in Newton, Iowa, breaking bones above his ankle. He had surgery at MercyOne Hospital in DesMoines to stabilize and close the wound, but will have more surgery in the Twin Cities to insert plates, screws, etc.

In a Facebook post, Dan explained that he was on a ladder getting fabric off of an outdoor cross that the ladder was leaning on. Two people were holding the ladder, but the cross cracked at the base and Dan had to jump clear, but in the process landed hard and broke the tibia and fibia bones in his right ankle.

Dan wrote, "My dear friend Dianna Clark has been here the whole time, and Margaret Hutchens and Joshua Patty stayed until the surgery began."

Dan expects to be back in Minneapolis this week, and, in an eblast on Monday, October 23, wrote, "Thank you for your prayers and your love for Keith and me! I am receiving wonderful care from MercyOne in DesMoines."

In Dan's absence, pastoral care will be provided by elders; check eblasts for names and contact information for elders who have volunteered to step in. Since Dan sends the eblasts, these notices may be not as regular as we're used to. Possible changes in the Coffee Hour and Happy Hour schedules may occur. And one more thing: Dan's fun-filled Cidery Tour, set for Sunday, October 19, is cancelled.

Thirteen board members and staff participated in FCC's regular monthly board meeting on Tuesday, October 17. Highlights from the meeting include the following:

- FCC has committed to twice-a-month food delivery for EveryMeal at Whittier School. New volunteers are welcome, and can sign up on FCC's website.
- •Jay Hillestad reported on the work of the Ad Hoc Visioning Committee, which aims to get input from the congregation about the priorities of FCC's ministries. Input will be from a survey and from small group meetings.
- The Nominating Committee will be contacting people about leadership roles for the coming year. Members are Jen Krengel, Paul Rottschaefer and Mike Hesano.
- Treasurer Pat Dunlop reported that, because income from SpringHouse tenants and ad hoc groups is higher than expected, each church's contribution to the 2023 SH budget may be slightly reduced. She also reported that at the end of September, FCC pledges were running slightly ahead of expectations.

How to "Be An Ally" for people experiencing homelessness

Align Minneapolis is an interfaith collaboration of 17 Minneapolis churches (including First Christian Church), synagogues, mosques and people with lived experiences working together to address homelessness and poverty. The following item was in a recent Align newsletter, and our Align representatives, Pastor Dan Adolphson and Karen Kandik, wanted to share this with our readers:

When we at Align or our partners at Street Voices of Change are speaking in the community and at Align member congregations we are always asked the question "what can I do?" One thing that everyone in our network can do is be an Ally to people experiencing homelessness and over the next few months in our newsletters we will be exploring ways to be an Ally.

Educate yourself and let go of misconceptions. Understand that each person's experience of homelessness is unique and that everyone experiencing homelessness is a whole person worthy of love and dignity. Challenge the common myths that some people have about homelessness.

Myth 1: People experience homelessness because of substance use. The reality is that many people that experience homelessness did

not have prior substance use challenges, but the stress and negative impact of homelessness does cause some people to develop substance use disorders.

Myth 2: People experiencing homelessness should just get a job. Most people experiencing homelessness have income and many work at jobs. The challenge comes in finding rents that are affordable to people who have fixed incomes like social security or disability, or that are affordable with lower wage jobs. Additionally, some background history such as having a prior eviction can make it much harder to find a place to rent.

Myth 3: People experiencing homelessness want to remain homeless. Most people experiencing homelessness want to have their own place that is safe and comfortable. The system of shelter, case management and housing programs has many holes and sometimes people are not able to navigate it to reach their goal of accessing housing. And when someone gets into housing, they may need additional supports to keep the housing.
