SpringHouse Board Notes

The SpringHouse Board met Sunday, November 12. Highlights from the meeting include the following:

- SpringHouse Treasurer Andy Rennert reviewed the proposed SH budget for 2024. Budgets for many expense categories were increased slightly, but a few were decreased. The annual congregational shares would be slightly less than in 2022, but the congregations may again be asked to again contribute to the capital budget. The board voted to approve the proposed budget, but it now goes to each congregation's governing board for approval.
- The meeting dates and leadership rotation were set for 2024. First meeting will be Sunday, February 25, 2 pm by Zoom.
- Mike Cackoski of the Building Committee reviewed various repairs and upcoming inspections

There are many of you who signed on to help in a variety of ways while I was gone. Some of you are serving on newly created committees and others are serving in new ways or have taken on added ways to serve. Members are the heart of Disciples of Christ churches. 


Thanksgiving Day Interfaith Service November 23, 10 a.m. In-person and Online
